October and November LMC Sessions



After a two day session in Tipton in September, Class XIII of Leadership Mitchell County continued their leadership journey to Lincoln and Ellsworth on October 10th.

Pastor Kaye Metzler started the day with a presentation on Leadership in Faith. Carol Cordel, Class X, and board members Phyllis Shurts and Mary Jane Chapman, covered the following four Kansas Leadership Center Competencies: Diagnose Situation, Manage Self, Intervene Skillfully and Energize Others.

The highlight of the day was

the tour of the Ellsworth Correctional Facility hosted by Todd Britton. The tour began with the history of the E.C.F. and Class XIII having lunch with the inmates. The main tour followed and included viewing the facilities, the pods where the inmates spend most of their time, offender work programs, and how private industries play a critical role in developing skills and abilities that will serve offenders on their release. The tour concluded with an inmate sharing his personal story about life in prison and how the E.C.F. has changed his life for the better.

LMC Class XIII then met on Wednesday, Nov. 7 at Carrico Implement and Agco for their agriculture/agribusiness and ag technology session.

Speakers for the morning session were Jeff Bechard from AgMark; Scott Chapman from the extension agency; local farmers Brent McCullough, Darrin Gronewoller and Eric Eilert; Joe Ortner from Carrico Implement and Andrea Harms from Farmway Co-op.

The afternoon session took place at Agco and started with a short tour of the new research and development facility. After the tour Jeff Zimmer, LMC board member and Farmway Credit Union employee, gave the class a presentation on financing farmers and ranchers and the benefits versus risks involved.

LMC will hold their next session about healthcare and education on Tuesday, Jan., 8, 2013 at the Mitchell County Hospital and North Central Kansas Technical College Campus.
